### Description of Categories:

- Category A Events that have the capacity to cause error but none occurred.
- Category B An error occurred but the med did not reach the patient.
- Category C An error that reached the patient but did not cause the patient harm or require increased monitoring.
- Category D An error that resulted in the need for increased patient monitoring but no patient harm.
- Category E An error that resulted in a temporary change in patient condition and required increased monitoring. Treatment or intervention may have been required.
- Category F An error that resulted in initial or prolonged hospitalization and caused patient harm.
- Category G An error that resulted in permanent patient harm.
- Category H An error that resulted in a near death event (i.e., anaphylaxis, cardiac arrest).
- Category I An error that resulted in patient death.
